## FOCUS – WINNIPEG CLUB

The Winnipeg Club currently has 17 members. Their club is the oldest club in the Western Canada Federation with a charter date of April 1927 so this year they will be celebrating their 97<sup>th</sup> anniversary year. For many years, they held a golf tournament, but this fundraiser has been discontinued. The legacy, however, lives on because they donated \$50,000 over the years to support Dr. McGavok, University of Manitoba with his research related to postnatal Indigenous diabetes. The Winnipeg Club along with other service clubs also supported Camp Manitou which was a camp for diabetic children for many years. It was initially formed in 1900. The clubs eventually sold the camp to the Winnipeg Jets who now use it for sports camps for Indigenous children. In 1952, they initiated the Cosmo Homes Project whereby the club had 82 suites that they used to rent out to low-income individuals. However, they needed to raise over three million dollars to update and renovate and decided at that time, to sell it. The proceeds went into the Winnipeg Foundation which invested the monies along with other monies from other charities. Today the club receives \$35,000 to \$40,000 each year which is used to support their various causes. Current fundraisers include Grey Cup ticket sales, and they are currently looking at other fundraising ideas.

They meet every 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday so if you are ever in the city, drop by as they would love to have you. They have various social events, one of the most recent is their Christmas Dinner. Rather than buy gifts for each other, they buy newborn baby outfits and donate them to a charity for single mothers. This past year, they purchased over 50 outfits for the newborns. Way to go Winnipeg Club. This year the Winnipeg Club will be hosting the May Annual Convention. Their club has been hard at it and will be delivering a top-notch convention. Plan to attend!

The Winnipeg Club continues to serve its community and the Federation. Frank Dojack was the Governor in 1954 and Bob Dojack (Frank's son) was Governor in 1991-92. Bob is still a member today. I apologize if I have missed any other members who served as Governor. Our current WCF Lt. Governor Greg Nicol is a member of the Winnipeg Club. Thanks to all members for their hard work. Congratulations to the Winnipeg Club for being the oldest club in the Federation and still going strong! Your legacy of service provided to the City of Winnipeg and the province of Manitoba for the many years your club has been in existence is exemplary!

## **FOCUS – MEMBERSHIP EVENTS**

Clubs are encouraged to have membership events to invite individuals to join our great organization. I know all clubs are committed and want new members to join. Cl is examining ways to help clubs meet that goal. I recently attended a meeting of a Cl Membership Committee and Governors. The committee is examining how they might support clubs regarding membership. At the meeting, there was some informal sharing of ideas about membership and members. This list is in no way formal or a recommendation by this committee, but if you find some ideas useful or inspirational that great. Here is a summary of some of the ideas:

- It is important to maintain the history of the club. As well as trying to attract new members, it is important to retain current members.
- Talk as a club about what is going to attract new members
- When you think of asking someone to join drop a decade if you are 77 years old, speak to someone who is in their 60's, if you are 40 years old, speak to someone who is in their 30's
- Networking is important
- Remain upbeat & positive
- We need to have a digital platform and presence. Ask young individuals to join. Get new members to help with the development of social media for your club (what we do and why we do it)
- Have a "meet the club" night but don't pressure individuals to join. A cocktail and appetizer night is one option
- Ask individuals to join in your events or membership events
- It's great if the events are somehow connected to our cause (diabetes or diabetes research)
- Work at water stations at local "Walks" or "Marathons" and wear your Cosmo apparel.
  Have a label on the water bottle with contact information.
- Have a social event "paint and beverage" night
- Support other charities and network
- Have club business cards and brochures made up
- Make sure your website has access to contact information for potential members
- Talk to the people that you give money to
- Ask every member to bring one new potential member to an event, a meeting, or membership event
- Any events that you work at, be sure to wear your club shirt
- Set up a booth at trade fair
